

Christopher S. Sontchi is a United States Bankruptcy Judge for the District of Delaware and a frequent speaker in the United States and internationally on issues relating to corporate reorganizations. He is a Lecturer in Law at The University of Chicago Law School and an Adjunct Professor of Law at Widener Law School in Wilmington, Delaware. He is also a member of the National Conference of Bankruptcy Judges, American Bankruptcy Institute, Turnaround Management Association and INSOL International.

Judge Sontchi was a member of the *Committee on Financial Contracts, Derivatives and Safe Harbors* of the American Bankruptcy Institute's Commission to Study the Reform of Chapter 11 and recently testified on the safe harbors for financial contracts before the Subcommittee on Regulatory Reform, Commercial and Antitrust Law of the House Committee on the Judiciary. He has published articles on valuation, asset sales and safe harbors.

Judge Sontchi attended the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill where he was elected to *Phi Beta Kappa* and obtained a B.A. with distinction in Political Science. He received his J.D. from The University of Chicago Law School, after which he returned to his native Delaware to serve as a law clerk in the Delaware Supreme Court.
