Professor Kamensky is the Co-Director of the Altman-Paulson Initiative on Bankruptcy, Restructuring and Financial Distress at the Leonard N. Stern School of Business at New York University where he is also an Adjunct Professor. He is also the Executive Director of the Bankruptcy Workshop organized by the Initiative and held at NYU Stern.

Professor Kamensky has nearly 25 years of industry experience with a strong track record of success in special situations and distressed investing across the capital structure, in both public and private markets.
