

Craig Goldblatt is a judge on the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Delaware, where he has served since his appointment in April 2021. Prior to his appointment, Judge Goldblatt was a bankruptcy litigator in the Washington, D.C. office of WilmerHale, where his practice primarily involved the representation of financial institutions and other commercial creditors in complex bankruptcy litigation and appeals. Earlier in his career, Judge Goldblatt served as a law clerk to Hon. Richard D. Cudahy of the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit and Hon. David H. Souter of the Supreme Court of the United States.

Judge Goldblatt is a Conferee in the National Bankruptcy Conference (where he serves as Secretary) and is a Vice President of the American College of Bankruptcy. He has also been active in the Business Bankruptcy Committee of the American Bar Association's Business Law Section. Judge Goldblatt has also served on the Education Committee of the National Conference of Bankruptcy Judges and as an adjunct professor (teaching classes focused on bankruptcy law) at Georgetown University Law Center and George Washington University Law School.

Judge Goldblatt earned his law degree, with honors, in 1993 from the University of Chicago Law School, where he served as Comment Editor of the University of Chicago Law Review. He earned his bachelor's degree, *magna cum laude*, in 1990 from Georgetown University.
